COVID-19 STATEMENT

Ironstone Farm takes our responsibility seriously to keep our community and team members safe. Our organization continues to follow the local guidelines provided by the Andover Public Health department and regulations set at the state and federal levels.

To all members of the Ironstone community: **If you do not feel well or are exhibiting severe symptoms of COVID-19, we ask that you consult a Medical Profession or provide a negative COVID test before coming on the property.** All inconveniences due to COVID-19-related illness will not be penalized. We appreciate your cautiousness and understanding during this pandemic!



FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What does therapy involve at Ironstone?

"Equine-assisted therapy" is one of the services offered at Ironstone Farm. Licensed physical and occupational therapists work as part of a team with equine professionals and volunteers, using horses as a therapeutic tool that enables clients to effectively reach established goals. The walking horse provides a unique movement that simulates a natural walking movement while the individual is straddling the horse. This can help to improve balance, muscle tone and strength, posture, stability and mobility, coordination, sensory regulation, attention, communication, and improved functioning in everyday tasks.

What is the cost? Are there third-party payers that can help to offset the costs of therapy?

An unmounted evaluation is \$175. Each 30-minute treatment session is \$85, plus a \$25 horse fee that Ironstone Therapy pays to the farm for use of the facility and horses (total of \$110 per session). We accept insurance with appropriate physician documentation and insurance company approval if PT or OT outpatient services for the stated diagnosis are covered and hippotherapy is not excluded. Without insurance coverage, we offer "fee for service" treatment sessions. We also participate in the Challenge Unlimited Sponsor A Child Fund for those who qualify as funds allow.

Is special clothing necessary, and what about helmets?

Close-toe shoes and helmets are required to participate in equine-assisted activities. Dress comfortably and appropriately for the season. We do have an indoor heated/air-conditioned arena- but for the safety and health of our horses, we are only able to heat our spaces to up to 45 degrees in winter and cooled to 85 degrees in summer.

Ironstone Farm does have helmets to loan to participants. **We require that clients use an equestrian ASTM/SEI-approved helmet.** In the case of clients who are unable to safely use an equestrian helmet, the therapist can assess for the appropriate use of a soft, lightweight infant-style head guard.

Will my child learn to ride a horse through Ironstone Therapy?

The horse is used as a therapeutic tool that provides the unique dynamic movement utilized by the therapist to enhance therapeutic activities. Although your child may spend some of all of their therapy session on the horse, your child will not learn to ride and control the horse. Once therapy goals are met, we may recommend progressing to our therapeutic riding program, where your child can learn to ride if desired.



IRONSTONE THERAPY PROGRAM GUIDELINES

Enrollment Procedures

Before you begin, please make sure that you read and understand all information regarding enrollment for therapy and the terms of our Fee Agreement.

1. Please complete and return to us the following forms:
 - a. **Emergency Authorization, Assumption of Risks and Liability Release** form
 - b. **Client Consent** form
 - c. **Client Information** form
 - d. **Fee Schedule and Agreement** form
 - e. **Client History/Intake** form
 - f. **Physician's Referral** form

PLEASE NOTE: The referring physician must include a diagnosis (ICD-10) code **and** prescribe either a PT or OT evaluation or treatment as indicated to include the use of equine assistance.

2. If you will be using your medical insurance to cover a portion of the cost of therapy, please attach a copy of both sides of your insurance card along with your completed paperwork.

In order to schedule the initial evaluation, we will have to receive all of the above-mentioned forms. Once we receive all the necessary paperwork, we will call you to schedule your initial appointment or add your name to the waitlist.

Setting Up Equine-Assisted Therapy

If you are not paying privately, Ironstone Therapy will contact your insurance company or another third party for approval of treatment coverage before regular treatment appointments are scheduled.

Please be aware that eligibility or pre-approval from your insurance company is not a guarantee of payment. You are ultimately responsible for payment, authorizations, and the number of authorized visits.

We currently have a waitlist for therapy. Once we have identified a potential weekly opening for your child, we will contact you to schedule an initial *unmounted* evaluation with one of our physical or occupational therapists. Your therapist will then develop a medically oriented treatment plan, including long and short-term therapeutic goals.

Once treatment begins, your therapist will reassess progress towards goals on a regular basis and revise treatment with the ultimate goal of transitioning into our Challenge Unlimited Program or discharge from therapy once goals are met.



Scheduling and Cancellation Policies

- **All scheduling and canceling of therapy treatments must be done through the office at 978-475-4056 ext. 1.** An answering machine is available to leave messages after hours. **IF YOU ARE CALLING TO CANCEL THE SAME DAY OF YOUR SESSION, PLEASE USE EXTENSION 1 FOR OUR SAME-DAY CANCELLATION LINE.**
- Cancellations made within **24 hours or less** before an appointment will be subject to a **\$25 fee.**
- We ask that you call and notify the office as soon as you know that you will not be able to keep an appointment. **Please do not rely on informing your therapist of scheduling changes.**
- If you have three consecutive cancellations or no-shows, we reserve the right to suspend treatment and to offer that time to another client on a permanent basis. We will make every attempt to find you another suitable therapy time.
- Ironstone Therapy provides service in all weather, with the exception of hazardous driving conditions when a public announcement restricts travel. **If cancellation is necessary, we will call you to cancel your appointment. Do not assume that sessions are canceled due to weather.**
- If your scheduled therapist is unable to work on a day on which you have an appointment, we will make every effort to provide a substitute therapist for the designated treatment session. However, if a substitute is not available, we reserve the right to call and cancel your session. We will try to find a make-up session in the same week for you if possible.

This Fee is not covered by insurance

***A \$25 horse fee is added on for all mounted sessions** - This is a fee that Ironstone Therapy, Inc is responsible for paying to Ironstone Farm for the use of the facility and horses. It goes towards the facility maintenance/operation and care of the herd. **This fee is NOT billable to insurance companies** and, therefore will be the responsibility of the client, in addition to any copays, coinsurance, deductibles, etc.

INSURANCE VERIFICATION OF BENEFITS SUGGESTED QUESTIONS

Your insurance company may cover some or all of the cost of Physical or Occupational therapy at Ironstone Farm. The IT program manager will call your insurance company to verify your coverage and benefits. However, it is not only helpful but also your responsibility to also verify your specific plan details, as you are ultimately responsible for payment for services rendered. The following are examples of questions you may want to ask when speaking with your Insurance company.

Calling to verify benefits for outpatient occupational or physical therapy services:

1. **Do I have benefits to cover an out-of-network or non-participating provider?** (HPHC is in-network for Ironstone Therapy)
2. **Does coverage run on a calendar year or a plan year- if plan year, when does it start?**
3. **What is my deductible? After my deductible is met, what is my copay or coinsurance?**
4. **Is there a limit on the number of visits per plan year? Is that for PT/OT only, or is it for all therapies combined?**

IF AUTISM DIAGNOSIS

- a. **Is there an exclusion on the maximum number of therapy visits allowed/ do I have unlimited visits?**
5. **How many visits have I already used?** (You will want to keep track of your number of therapy visits and let the IT program manager know when you reach the limit)
6. **Do I need an MD referral or a prior authorization?**
7. **Is re-certification needed? After how many visits?**
8. **Is any specific service excluded?** (CPT treatment codes used: 97530; 97110; 97112; 97532; 97535)
9. **Are there any exclusions to my policy?**

The best approach in navigating the insurance process is for both Ironstone Therapy and you as a member to gather as much information as possible. Please let us know if you have any questions.
